### **Professor Henrik C. Wegener**

Henrik C. Wegener has been Rector of the University of Copenhagen since March 2017. He is an expert on food safety, zoonoses, antimicrobial resistance and emerging infectious diseases. He has served as advisor to national and international authorities & governments (including as Chair of the High Level Group of the EC Scientific Advice Mechanism), international organizations and private companies, as well as universities and research foundations. He is presently serving on several national and international committees and boards on food safety, veterinary public health, and research policy. Professor Wegener is a former Pro-Rector at the Technical University of Denmark.
